Mark Coppin, M.Ed., ATP is the Director of Disability Services at North Dakota State University in Fargo, ND. He has over 34 years of experience in the field of Assistive Technology. He has presented at state, regional, national, and international conferences on such topics as technology and teaching, special education, assistive technology, mobile devices in education, and autism. Twice he has presented at the United Nations on the importance of accessibility. He is also an Apple Distinguished Educator. In 2013, he was one of 10 educators recognized as a Champion of Change by the White House. He currently serves on the SXSWEDU (South By SouthWest Education) advisory board.



Sady Paulson has cerebral palsy and uses Apple's accessibility tech like Switch Control to interact with her computers, iPhone and iPad. She is an Independent Videographer and national speaker on the power of accessibility. She is also an Apple Distinguished Educator. She was featured in, and edited, the 2016 commercial launching the re-designed Apple accessibility website.

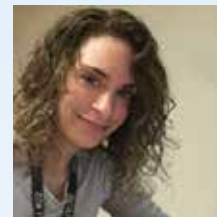
